

U. R. Ananthamurthy

Not all storytellers bring the imagination to life; some of them showcase the day-to-day realities with a dose of realism in them. U. R. Ananthamurthy was one such storyteller, the sixth Kannada writer to receive the Jnanpith Award, in 1994. The writer was born and raised in Thirthalli taluk, Shimoga district, and had his early education at a traditional Sanskrit school in Doorvasapura. He obtained the master's degree in arts from the University of Mysore and completed doctorate from the University of Birmingham in 1966.

In 1965, he published his debut novel, Samskara, which explored the topics of death, religious beliefs, and traditions and cultures in the midst of an ever-changing world. The novel also found a larger audience on screens in 1970 when it was made into a film, which eventually earned the President's Gold Medal, Swarna Kamal, for Karnataka. In addition, his literary works include Prashne, Aakasha Mattu Bekku, Bharathipura, Avasthe, Bara, Ghatashraddha, and many more. In retrospect, most of his artwork focuses on the psychological elements of humans brought to light via various situations, times, and circumstances.

As a writer, he created a sense of relatability by expressing simple reality in his work. His style of writing questioned the status quo with the intent of understanding rather than rebelling. Unfortunately, the writer passed away on 22nd August 2014 due to kidney failure & cardiac arrest, leaving behind a legacy of thought-provoking works.


► Discipline and Responsibility



World Environment Day

A Future with Eco-friendly Touch!

It also established a system in 2022 for disposing of household waste at licensed recycling support facilities, where the waste is isolated from the source, resulting in high recycling rates. These initiatives displayed that where there is a will, there is a way; combating plastic pollution is possible if we join our hands together for the planet.
